Glass Recycling

CAT 9 residents have expressed interest in where to go to recycle glass, since the City of Tucson and our service provider do not accept glass for curbside recycling. One location a local resident uses is at the Rio Vista Natural Resource Park at 3974 N Tucson Blvd. To get there from here, go east on Prince and turn left at Tucson Blvd. Go to the end, and the glass recycling bin is on the left as you enter the park.

While this location may be the closest to our community, the City of Tucson also offers a number of other locations that may better meet your need.
